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Bicyclist struck, dragged by vehicle in Natick

A 30-year-old bicyclist was hospitalized with serious injuries after being struck by a car and dragged for nearly 300 yards on Route 16 in Natick Wednesday night, police said.

The cyclist suffered extensive injuries and was med-flighted to a Worcester hospital after the 7:25 p.m. accident, said Natick Police Lieutenant Brian Grasley.

Police did not identify the cyclist or the driver of the 2002 blue Volvo sedan involved in the incident.

As of Thursday evening, police did not know the cyclist's condition.

Grasley said a preliminary investigation showed the person riding the bicycle was dragged eastbound on Route 16 by the car for around 860 feet. Police are continuing the investigation, which includes a reconstruction of the accident, he said.

No other injuries were reported and no determination had been made as to whether charges will be filed.

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
