the long-term," Principal Ronald Jackson said on Thursday.

He said spending the grant will likely be spread out over several years and go toward such areas as before- and after-school programs, nutritional supplies, and fitness equipment. The grant is designated to be used for health and wellness programming or equipment, according to the NFL.

Players also coached the youngsters through 60 minutes of exercise during the "Ultimate NFL Physical Education Class" held at the school's event earlier this week. As an added bonus, the school will keep the equipment used during that class.

"The kids were totally into it and they were all still talking about it," when they returned to a normal day of classes Wednesday, Jackson said.

The principal said athletics, including football, basketball and lacrosse, helped to keep him focused when he was in school.

Along with keeping students fit, being active "really does keep them anchored," by providing a balance to the academic focus inside the classroom, Jackson said.

Around 5,600 schools across the country and 156 in New England entered the NFL's contest and a chance to win the grant along with a visit from a professional NFL player or players. At the beginning of the academic year, schools entered the contest by hosting their own rallies on "Back to Football Friday" to celebrate the start of the NFL season and then submitting photos and essays. One school in each of the league's 32 markets was chosen, along with two at-large winners.

The school on Gordon Avenue entered for its first time this year.

Peter O'Reilly, the NFL's vice president of fan strategy and marketing, said it was chosen for several reasons, including its commitment to the "Back to Football Friday" event and the "way they articulated how important the combination of education and physical activity are to creating well-rounded students."

"They showed they had a real plan in place for how they were going to address that," he added.

When the school found out it had won last month, "we were a little bit stunned." said Jackson.

The Henry Grew School has received a \$10,000 check through professional sports before.

In 2007, Hyde Park native and Red Sox relief pitcher Manny Delcarmen gave a check of that amount to the school through money raised at a charity bowling tournament. The bulk of the money benefited the school's library while \$2,500 was set aside for athletics across the district. That oversized check was presented before a game at Fenway Park.

"NFL PLAY 60," the league's "primary and largest social and corporate responsibility initiative," according to O'Reilly, launched three years ago and focuses on motivating students nationwide to make healthy choices, including being active for at least 60 minutes each day. The initiative is designed to tackle childhood obesity and is implemented through advertisements, online
