

Two seriously injured in separate stabbings in Roxbury, downtown Boston

A man and woman each received life-threatening injuries in separate stabbings in Boston on Sunday night, according to Boston Police.

The woman was stabbed multiple times at a home on Marcella Street in Roxbury. Police received a 911 at 7:50 p.m. reporting that a man and woman were fighting at the two-story house. The caller said the man was attacking the woman.

The woman was taken to Brigham and Women's Hospital. Police were still investigating at 9:30 Sunday night. They had taped off the two-story home, and blood was visible on the porch.

In another incident, a man in his early 20s was stabbed at the intersection of State Street and Congress Street in downtown Boston just after 9 p.m.. He was taken to Boston Medical Center.

Paul Butler, 35, of Melrose, said he was walking past the entrance to the State Street MBTA Station when he saw a man bleeding from his neck. The man was holding a bloody shirt to his throat, said Butler.

Butler said he stayed with the man until the police arrived. The man was conscious, said Butler.

The State Street MBTA Station was still taped off around 11 p.m.

Further information on the victims' conditions was not available.
