State to unveil 3 proposals to improve bike, foot access to Jamaica Plain

The state plans to unveil three proposals to improve safety and access for pedestrians and cyclists crossing Ferber Street and Francis Parkman Drive to get to and from Jamaica Pond in Jamaica Plain, officials said.

The results of a recently-completed draft study, including three potential solutions suggested by the study, will be presented for public feedback at a meeting scheduled for Wednesday. The study, done by the state's Metropolitan Area Planning Council, is the first of a series of studies to be conducted in the area.
