Ward 4 Democratic Committee endorses Golar Richie

The Ward 4 Democratic Committee has endorsed Charlotte Golar Richie to become the next mayor of Boston, according to an announcement Wednesday from Richie's campaign.

"I'm truly honored to have the support of Ward 4, and I am humbled that this strong and progressive group of Boston residents support me as their next mayor," Richie said in a statement.

Ward 4 includes parts of the Back Bay, Fenway, and the South End.

The committee also endorsed three City Council candidates running for district seats: Suzanne Lee, incumbent Tito Jackson, Josh Zelman, and three City Council candidates running for at-large seats: Michelle Wu, incumbent Andrea Bevilacqua, and Jeff Bane, according to the announcement from Richie's campaign.
