


Police say person shot dead Nov. 16 was Dorchester man, 21

Police on Sunday identified the man who was shot and killed last weekend during a shooting in Dorchester that left another man injured.

Andrew McGee was one of two men shot in front of a home on Whitman Street near Norfolk Street just before 11 p.m. on Nov. 16, according to a statement from Boston Police.

McGee, 21, of Dorchester, was taken to Boston Medical Center, where he was pronounced dead, police said.

On Saturday evening, November 16, 2013 just before 11:00 p.m., two young men were shot in front of 7 Whitman Street in Dorchester. Andrew McGee, age 21, died from his injuries. The other young man, age 19, is currently in critical condition.

The Boston Police Homicide Unit is actively investigating the circumstances surrounding this violent crime and would like any information the community may have. The cooperation of the community is vital to successfully identifying and capturing the person or persons responsible for this act.

Police did not identify the other man who was shot, a 19-year-old.

He also was taken to Boston Medical Center, where he remained in critical condition on Sunday, police said.

Officers found both men suffering from gunshot wounds after the ShotSpotter system, which acoustically detects gunshots, sent an alert to police.

A resident told an investigator that night that she heard several shots in rapid succession.
