Wentworth Institute of Technology celebrated the opening of a \$43 million, 305-bed dormitory on its Fenway campus Tuesday. The seven-story hall has 72 apartment-style units. Named “The Apartments @ 525,” the building began housing students at the start of this semester. Wentworth now provides on-campus dormitory housing for 89 percent of its students. Mayor Martin J. Walsh joined state and city lawmakers at the ribbon-cutting.
