Are the worst of the holiday getaway blues over?

That's what data collected by the Massachusetts Department of Transportation suggests, as travel times on Route 3 from the Braintree split to the Sagamore Bridge appeared to peak Friday morning, then drop steadily after noon.

The trend was the same along the Mass Pike from the Allston-Brighton tolls to Interstate 84, according to the MassDOT data.

Of course, there's always the possibility of last-minute travelers taking to the roads this evening as they apparently did on Thursday.

It's not over till it's over — when everybody who wants to be somewhere wakes up there Saturday morning.

Data provided by MassDQT also showed that traffic Thursday was worse than on the same day before the holiday weekend a year ago, according to the data.

Last year, travel times plateaued at around 1 p.m., when it took more than an hour and 10 minutes — about twice as long as when there's no traffic — to travel the Braintree split-Sagamore stretch. Commutes of more than an hour continued until around 6 p.m., before trailing off.

On Thursday, along that same stretch, it took drivers nearly an hour and a half when traffic was at its worst to crawl along that same stretch of road. The drive was slow going for roughly the same stretch of time, from 1 to 6 p.m.

After letting up somewhat briefly Thursday evening, travel times surged again, as drivers hoping to beat the traffic with a late-but-quick drive down to the Cape instead found themselves stuck behind the wheel for between an hour and a half, from 9 p.m. until shortly past midnight.

The patterns were similar on the Allston-Brighton-Interstate 84 stretch.

Last year, traffic was at its worst between 3 and 5 p.m. on the day before the long weekend. Drive times took as long as an hour and 10 minutes, for a trip that, without traffic, takes about 45 minutes.

On Thursday, the same trip took as long as an hour and a half.
