Tips on how to prevent your assets from becoming 'unclaimed'

There's more than \$2.4 billion worth of unclaimed property in Massachusetts

Unclaimed property comes from companies that — under a law enacted in 1950 — are required to transfer to the state all bank accounts, stock holdings, uncashed checks, and other assets that have lain untouched for, typically, three years. The time-frame can vary, depending on the property type.

But there's no deadline on when the true owner of an account can step forward and get their money back.

The state of Massachusetts' Unclaimed Property Division has a list of several steps you can take to prevent your assets from winding up "unclaimed." The division suggests that you:

- Make deposits into accounts annually, even as little as a dollarwill be considered activity.
- Alert all concerned parties to any changes in your address.
- Keep accurate financial records of bank accounts, stocks, safe deposit boxes and insurance policies.



Search Public DMV Records

- Cash all dividend checks, insurance benefits, and wages, no matter how small. This will qualify you as an active owner.
- Also, if you ever receive a check for a claim you filed with the Unclaimed Property Division, make sure to cash it.



Officials there said there actually have been cases where

people went through the whole process to claim unclaimed

assets in their name only to never cash the check the state sent them. In such cases, the money
eventually winds up becoming unclaimed propert, again.

Anyone can look up their name on the state-run website <u>www.findmassmoney.com</u> to see if they're owed money.
