A Pokémon Go player wants to let the City of Boston know of a (ahem) serious problem: one of the critters has infested a Boston street.

A user of the new popular mobile game sent a photo to the city's non-emergency tip service, BOS:311, showing a Krabby Pokémon depicted on Albany Street.

The submission was filed under "rodent sighting" and proclaimed "Krabby on Albany Street!!"

Pokémon Go, an augmented reality game, uses the player's smartphone camera to show characters from the game in real environments. Players wander the neighborhood, phone in hand, looking for marked locations and hidden creatures to capture.



The app has seen a surge in popularity, including in Boston: on a city-by-city <u>ranking</u> of places where the term "Pokemon Go" had been searched the most on Google, Boston ranked second, tied with Orlando and trailing only Detroit.
