Only one wicked lucky Powerball player — someone who bought their ticket in Massachusetts — will claim the \$758.7 million jackpot.

But plenty of other people won smaller prizes. (So, make sure to check your ticket!)

In addition to the grand prize ticket sold at a store in Chicopee, <u>261,642 other tickets</u> were sold in Massachusetts with at least some payout.

Two of those other tickets won \$1 million prizes. Seven others nabbed a cool \$50,000.

The rest of the winning tickets can be cashed in for as little as \$4 up to \$400.

Nationwide, nearly <u>9.4 million tickets</u> sold for Wednesday night's drawing won something, splitting a combined total of about \$135 million in winnings (not counting the jackpot, of course).

Tickets <u>cost</u> \$2 each, though players can spend an extra \$1 to add on the "Power Play" feature which boosts their payout if they win prizes (except the jackpot).
