President Trump on Thursday <u>claimed</u> the number of people who died in the aftermath of Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico "did not go up by much" beyond the initial counts that were released just after the storm and put the death toll in the single or low double digits.

But Trump's assertion defies the findings of at least eight different studies that estimated the number of deaths to be at least several hundred, if not more than 1,000.

That includes one report that estimated the death toll was 2,975 - a figure that the government of Puerto Rico has adopted as the official count.



In a pair of tweets Thursday, Trump appeared to specifically attack the findings of that study.

The tweets came after Trump on <u>Wednesday</u>, as Hurricane Florence approached the Southeast US coast, attacked criticism lobbed in recent months over the federal government's response to Hurricane Maria in Puerto Rico, calling his administration's efforts "underappreciated."

Below is a list of studies that have estimated the death toll there. The list is arranged to show the most recent studies first.

2,975 deaths

August 2018 estimate from a <u>study</u> led by researchers at George Washington University (The Puerto Rican government commissioned this study. When the analysis was published, the government updated its official death toll to reflect this number after claiming for months that there were only 64 deaths.) **1,006—1,272 deaths**
